His carer, brother in law John Cardwell has also been a great volunteer at SWCA Competitions not just at South Lanarkshire but also at Stirling.

Teresa Brazier, friend of Mary Bell passed away very recently. Teresa like John was also very active at our Competitions in a volunteer role.

They will all be greatly missed and we pass on our condolences to all of their families.

Meetings:

I attended the British Curling AGM in December which was held in Stirling. We have a voting place on this Committee; there was very little business other than a small change to the Constitution which had to be made to ensure impartiality.

After the meeting I learnt that the new rink at Stirling which is due to be open all year is also available to ALL Curlers and not just the Elite squads. Ice can be booked via the Peak.

Competitions:

Very pleased to report that a number of Curlers who attended the Pairs in November at Stranraer were highly complementary. They especially enjoyed being able to mingle with others once the day's curling was finished. Our thanks go to Brian Park who spent a great deal of effort in ensuring this event went smoothly.

Several Clubs are now in the process of finalising Competitions which will be open to all our players, namely; Braehead no sweeping (10 Feb), Lockerbie Aviva Competition which is being finalised and looks like being 9 Feb, and finally South Lanarkshire with their annual Tunnocks (March 19-21).

Inter Club League; At the last meeting I informed the Committee that Ted and I spent several hours completing the full application for funding. I am pleased to report that this was successful and we have been awarded £2500.

Status report 10th January 2018

The Inaugural Inter Club League commenced on the 12th October 2017 with the first two games of the first round hosted by Stranraer playing against Stirling. Stranraer won the first home game 4-2 with the afternoon away game was peeled at 3-3.

As of today's date 3 rounds of the League have been completed and the competition has been played in a competitive but amiable spirit. The league standings are chopping and changing with each round and with two rounds still to go the table is still wide open. With each team having a bye in one of the 5 rounds the table will not be the full story until the last round but in the meantime the standings are worked out by the club who has won the most points from the points available. (i.e. 2 games won is 4pts from 4 games played with possible 8pts = 50%)

Funding

I have pleasure in confirming that the application for funding from the Postcode Lottery Community Trust has been successful and attach a copy of the email below. All the necessary paperwork has been completed and accepted by the Trust and we are currently awaiting the funds to be credited to the SWCA bank account. The amount is £2500 which is expected around the end of January. Further to the initial £500 from the committee (SIS trust) these funds will be distributed equally amongst the five participating clubs to reimburse them for the ice costs and for them help their players and volunteer coaches with travel expenses to away League games this season.

The award will be audited by the Postcode Lottery Community Trust and therefore a receipt will be required from each club secretary itemising where the funds have been spent. I suggest that this be in a standard format by means of a Pro Forma invoice in line with the application made and issued by the SWCA committee to each Club for them to sign as received.

It is hoped we can now attract further funding for next season from the same source and from a sponsor if we are able to source one.

Summary: I believe the Inter Club League has been a success so far this season and we hope to continue the competitive, sporting spirit through to the end of this season. The competition has introduced some new players to competitive curling and allowing them to be nurtured and mentored by the more experienced players. This is entirely the purpose of the League and long may it continue to do so.

Thank you to the SWCA committee for their support in getting the League off the ground, there have been challenges but thanks also the individual clubs, coaches and players alike for overcoming these to make the League a welcome addition to the development of Wheelchair Curling.

SWCA Report 13th January 2018

Training/Courses Please discuss whether there are any more training days which you wish me to look into putting on as time is getting short for this season. I also want to start looking at next season and whether people want things over the break as well.

Both the **Intro to Wheelchair Curling** Coaching course and **Advanced Wheelchair Coaching Modules** were well received, thanks to Sheila, Michael and Aileen. Please let me have suggestions for venues for these for next season.

UKCC level 1 The Final course of the year is being held at the Peak on Sunday 5th February, spaces are still available. It would be good to see some more curlers from SWCA going on this. A concern from some wheelchair curlers who may wish to do their UKCC Level 1 coaching course is lack of experience in coaching the standard delivery. Please can you encourage any wheelchair curlers thinking of doing this course that there will be support available? It will certainly be possible to put on a specific session where they can explore what is involved in advance of going on a level 1 course. One such curler has already benefitted from a coaching session in preparation for the Level 1 course.

World Wheelchair Championships 2019 Please can you let me know any ideas you may have around promoting the sport during the run up to this competition as it will be a huge opportunity? It would be great to see as many wheelchair curlers being able to take part in volunteering at this event.

Curlability Event 27th February at the Peak. I am running a small event for curlers of all abilities with any disability/impairment. It is not aimed at the more able wheelchair curlers but those who can't access standard SWCA competitions, who maybe short curl or who have additional needs such as a learning disability which hampers them from playing the standard game. I have four sheets for two sessions so will do a mixture of more competitive short games and shot maker type activities. I am looking for some helpers with this and an idea of numbers who might come, entry forms will go out next week hopefully.

Resources I have had a request for the Curling from a Wheelchair Skill Award** to be updated and want to know how much clubs use these and whether they are fit for purpose. If there is a need to update then this would be good to be done over the summer and I would need some volunteers to help with this. Or you may decide that you just want them aligned to the standard delivery skill awards as some clubs use them, with ideas for modification.

**BP commented that the current brochure was much too heavy due to excessive repetition and would benefit from severe pruning. Discussion ensued as to whether pruning should be carried out or guidance notes/basic check list be produced for first few lessons. HK to organise.
